The Albrecht Free Clinic provides free medical care to uninsured and underinsured residents of Washington County, Wisconsin (**proof of residency required**). Their healthcare providers, nurses, and volunteers donate their time and expertise in order to successfully improve the quality of life and health for our patients.

Hours of Operation

The clinic is open to the general public for visitation purposes Mondays - Thursdays 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. (Note: no patient medical services are available on Monday and Fridays.)

Patients may seek medical treatment and examinations at the following times:
