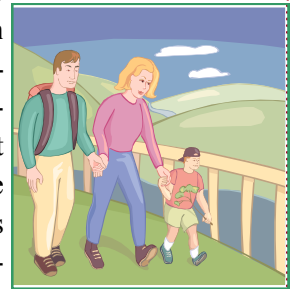

Student Led Conferences

Parent/Teacher/Student Conferences will be held on Tuesday, November 8 from 12:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. There will be no school on that day. If you have not already signed up for conferences, please call the office at 262-626-8427, ext. 1100 or 1000 to make an appointment as soon as possible. We do ask that a conference be scheduled for every student in grades 5K-5.

The student led conference format will again be used. Students will take part in the conference by sharing work with parents and reflecting on how they think they are doing in each subject. Of course, age level will factor into how involved the students are in the conferences. Students are required to attend their conference. If at all possible, it is recommended that siblings are not in the room at the time, so everyone can concentrate on the student. Siblings of school age will be able to be dropped off at a designated spot where they can be supervised doing fun activities for 15-20 minutes.

Student Drop-Off and Pick-Up



Please remember that students should not be on school grounds before 8:30 am unless they are signed up to attend one of the daycares or special morning programs. We do not provide supervision on the playground until 8:30. Quite a few students have been coming early and we are concerned for their safety.

Also, all students not attending after school daycare or Boys and Girls Club need to be picked up by 4:00 p.m. There is supervision at the two pick-up locations until that time. We realize that occasionally an emergency may arise. In those cases, students need to be picked up in the office as soon as possible. If you are able to do so, please call the office staff to inform them of the emergency and of the time you are expecting to be able to pick up your child. Please remember this is for emergencies only.

Phone Calls

When you call the school phone number 626-8427 your call will be answered by the District Receptionist and forwarded to the school or individual you are looking for.

When a call is placed from one of the school buildings it will come across your caller ID as 626-8427. The Receptionist is unable to identify who placed the call. If a voice mail has been left for you, please review your message before returning the call so she can transfer you to the correct person.

Please advise your children if they are making calls from a school phone to always leave you a message rather than hang up.
