Students Use Summer as a Time to Get Ahead

With the scheduling options that Kewaskum Career Academy (KCA) offers, it is not surprising that a number of students take advantage of this flexibility to gain experience through work and volunteerism. However, that can put added pressure on them to earn their credits on schedule. Summertime offers one opportunity to earn these needed credits. Numerous Math, Science, Social Studies courses will be offered at KCA this summer, so if you know your student is in need of credits, look for the course registration and bussing materials that were sent out on May 25, 2011. English is also available for credit recovery only (Only enroll your student in these courses if he or she needs to recover a credit from an English course which has been failed), but those courses will be held at the High School. Those forms were sent out on the 25th as well.

There are two important things to watch for on the forms. First, please note the KCA students are given priority registration for the morning (8:00 – 11:45) session to accommodate the KCA curriculum. However, if your schedule demands, they may register for the afternoon (12:15 – 4:00) session, but the course selection will be more limited. Second, you should also be sure to sign up for the morning session if you require bussing for your student. There will be no bussing offered in the afternoon. So look over the registration and bussing forms carefully and plan your summer now. Remember, one of the best ways to take advantage of the opportunities at KCA is to be prepared and complete one or two credits during the summer. That way your student can take full advantage of the upcoming school year.

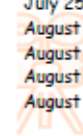
