

What type of diploma will my student earn through the Kewaskum Career Academy?

A student who successfully completes all required work and has earned all required credits will receive a Kewaskum High School diploma and is eligible to participate in the Kewaskum High School graduation ceremony

Can I return to Kewaskum High School?

Yes. Some students may find that they are successful in a small school environment and may choose to stay with KCA. However, other students use KCA as a stepping stone to renew their commitment to learning and earn their way back to Kewaskum High School.

Is there a cost to attend Kewaskum Career Academy?

No. There is no additional cost to attend KCA above and beyond the general fees you are required to pay to register with Kewaskum High School. Other optional fees for such things as yearbooks, ex-curricular activities and parking permits may apply.

Can my child participate in high school sports?

Yes, all KCA students are eligible to participate in any Kewaskum High School sport or club as long as they meet the academic and other requirements for that sport or club.

The Kewaskum Career Academy is based on the premise that all students can learn. This school is designed to provide an atmosphere whereby students who have been previously unsuccessful will develop an individualized learning plan that will match their educational and career goals.

What should I do next?

Students are referred to KCA through their high school guidance counselor and a student intervention team. Limited spaces are available. These students need to submit an application and meet with the staff of KCA. Students will be admitted at the beginning of each 9-week term. The submission of an application does not guarantee a placement at KCA. The student may be either admitted or referred back to the high school.

Credit Requirements:

The staff at the Career Academy will work with the student to establish an individual learning plan. The learning plan will be based on the student's graduation requirements and career goals. Unique courses will be created to meet the most diverse students' needs. Students must earn a total of 28 credits consisting of both core and elective credits:

English—4 Cr

Math—3 Cr

Science—3 Cr

Social Studies—3 Cr

PE/Health—2 Cr

Careers—1 Cr

In addition, students must earn 12 elective credits which includes 1 credit of community service, (equal to 30 hours of volunteering) and work experience. Students work experience may not equal more than 50% of their elective credits. Students are allowed to take elective credits through Kewaskum High School and may participate in any extra-curricular activity offered through the high school.

P.M. Session 12:45 p.m. to 3:45 p.m.

Your student will be assigned to a session based on availability and the individual needs of your student.

Attendance Policy

Here at the Kewaskum Career Academy, we believe that one of the keys to success in school is regular attendance. By state law, parents may excuse a student for not more than 10 days in a school year. Excused absences include illness, death in the family, required court appearances, designated religious holidays, and pre-planned absences. Parents are expected to notify the school at least 2 days prior to a pre-planned absence. Any other absences or absences in excess of 10 per year are considered unexcused and could result in a truancy citation and/or dismissal from the Kewaskum Career Academy.

Tardy Policy

Students are expected to be on time. Students who are tardy will be required to stay after school to make up time missed. Failure to stay will cause the tardy to count as unexcused. State law indicates that tardies count toward truancy.
