The Board of Education of Kewaskum Community Schools, in support of the aims of public education, believes that student behavior shall reflect standards of good citizenship expected of members of a democratic society. Self-discipline is one of the immediate important goals of education and its inculcation and practice are of great concern to the Board.

Students shall be expected to conduct themselves in keeping with their level of maturity, acting with due regard to constituted authority. This includes conformity to school rules and regulations and those provisions of law which apply.

Consideration for the rights and privileges of others, cooperation with all personnel in the school community, and basic self-respect for one's self shall be primary goals. High personal standards of courtesy, decency, honesty, morality and respectful relationships with others shall be maintained. Respect for real and personal property, pride in ones work and achievement within one's ability shall be expected of all students.

All employees of the District shall share responsibility for supervising the behavior of students and for seeing that they meet the standards of conduct that have been established by the Board, the District Administrator, or persons designated by him or the Board to formulate rules and regulations.

Students who are suspended or expelled from the Kewaskum Schools are not to be at school-sponsored activities or on school property during the time of suspension or expulsion. Students found on school property or at school-sponsored activities while suspended or expelled will be reported to the local law enforcement authorities for removal and citing of trespassing charges.
