The following are guidelines for students who use prescription EpiPens for the treatment of allergic reactions:

EpiPens will be kept in the locked first aid cabinet located in each school's office area, and a written record will be kept each time one is administered. A prescription medication form signed by the parent and doctor must be on file in the school office.

An EpiPen may only be carried by a student when the physician indicated the need to do so and a permission form to that effect is on file in the school office. These students should be cautioned by their doctors and parents that EpiPens are a prescribed medication for their use only and should not be touched by others.

Every EpiPen, whether kept in the school cabinet or carried, must have the student's name on it.
