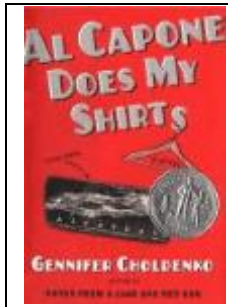


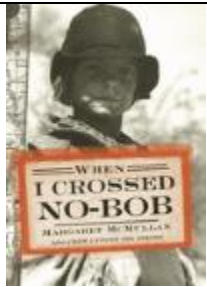
# Mr. Schultz Recommends:
