Child Find activities are public awareness activities, screenings, and evaluations designed to locate, identify, and refer all young children with disabilities and their families who may be in need of early intervention programs or special education services as early as possible.

Child Development Days are screening activities designed to assess your child's development across a number of areas including cognitive, speech, vision, and motor skills.

Child Development Days are open to all children living within the Kewaskum School District aged 2 years, 9 months and older.

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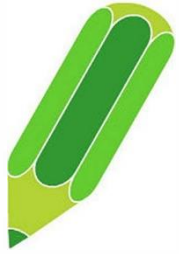
